





FIRST LESSON: PHILIPPIANS 1: 1-18a

1 Paul and Timothy, servants^[a] of Christ Jesus,

To all the saints in Christ Jesus who are in Philippi, with the bishops^[b] and deacons:^[c]

² Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

³ I thank my God every time I remember you, ⁴ constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, ⁵ because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. ⁶ I am confident of this, that the one

who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. ⁷ It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, ^[d] for all of you share in God's grace ^[e] with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. ⁸ For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. ⁹ And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight ¹⁰ to help you to determine what is best, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, ¹¹ having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God. ¹² I want you to know, beloved, ^[f] that what has happened to me has actually helped to spread the gospel, ¹³ so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard ^[g] and to everyone else that my imprisonment is for Christ; ¹⁴ and most of the brothers and sisters, ^[h] having been made confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, dare to speak the word ^[i] with greater boldness and without fear. ¹⁵ Some proclaim Christ from envy and rivalry, but others from goodwill. ¹⁶ These proclaim Christ out of love, knowing that I have been put here for the defense of the gospel; ¹⁷ the others proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely but intending to increase my suffering in my imprisonment. ¹⁸ What does it matter? Just this, that Christ is proclaimed in every way, whether out of false motives or true; and in that I rejoice.
