





First Lesson: Genesis 2: 4-7, 15-17; 3: 1-8

⁴These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created. In the day that the LORD^[a] God made the earth and the heavens, ⁵when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up—for the LORD God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground; ⁶but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground— ⁷then the LORD God formed man from the dust of the ground,^[b] and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being.

¹⁵The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. ¹⁶And the LORD God commanded the man, “You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; ¹⁷but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die.” **3** Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made.
