I assumed that news would spread fairly fast...in some form or another...until we were contacted by someone in Southern Arizona who watches the services online who saw the installation of the Call Committee at the 9:30 am worship service!

So, I will try to communicate more clearly.

During 2022, our Church Council wisely set in motion our contract with Auxano to lead our Vision Team through a process to understand who we are as a congregation, our strengths, our weaknesses, to clearly state our mission, and develop a vision for the future of Gloria de Cristo.

It was understood that one of the challenges of the near future is a pastoral transition. I love what I do, I just can't do it all as it needs to be done anymore, and GdC needs a new pastor to lead into the future mission. I will turn 70 in early October, and hopefully, GdC will have a new pastor in place by that time.

If not, I will continue to serve until the Call Committee and congregation agree on a candidate who accepts the call to be pastor of GdC. There may be a time of overlap of pastors, for the sake of a good transition.

My greatest hope and prayer is that GdC will continue growing and strong in mission as we are "walking with Jesus to bring new life and hope to every person!"

It is also my hope and prayer that you, all of you whom God called to be members in mission through Gloria de Cristo, would embrace and love your new pastor, as I have been blessed.

We will be in direct contact with Patricia Reed, Synod Liaison as we work through this process. This is just a beginning, our "Congregations in Transition" is 82 pages long, and is here to help us! The journey is long and we accept this responsibility with each of you in our prayers, we ask that you keep us in your prayers as well.

Lay Sacramentarians – Who / what are they?

Gloria de Cristo is blessed with having the ministry of lay Sacramentarians. In other faith constructs, they would be known as lay-Eucharistic ministers. These people—both men and women—are members of Gloria de Cristo and have the opportunity to extend the Lord's Table fellowship to brothers and sisters who are physically unable to join in the act of Holy Communion during worship services.

When our congregation gathers in worship, we hear of God's mighty acts and the love showed to us in Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. We share in the holy meal of the Lord's Supper; then we take that word of life, the bread and the cup of blessing, so that our home-bound brothers and sisters may share in these same gifts and be strengthened in communion with all the people of God.

Being a lay Sacramentarian is an extension of our corporate worship (worship as a body) here at Gloria de Cristo. It is not an independent act we do whenever it pleases us. Congregants receive Communion weekly unless otherwise arranged. The ideal time to take communion to shut-ins is Sunday afternoon, if possible, to complete the corporate worship experience they may have participated in virtually via live stream.

A script, training, and accountability are provided to baptized believers who seek to please God in all that they do. If you are interested in being part of this ministry, please contact Pastor Timm. Dr. Shirley coordinates the assignments.

Living with chronic conditions such as Arthritis, Parkinson's Disease, Terminal Cancer, debilitating pain, etc. can take a toll on your mental state. Chronic conditions are not only taxing on your body but can be extremely difficult to deal with emotionally. It can feel as though it has taken over every aspect of your life, sapping away joy and making every action harder.

Mentally adjusting to being in a long-term chronic condition and how that can change your life can feel overwhelming. Many patients have comorbid mental illnesses due to the difficult nature of living with their condition. The great news is, there are lots of ways to help you mentally cope with chronic conditions such as:

Acceptance Talking about what you are going through

Being kind to yourself Learning about pain science

Replacing negative thoughts with positive ones Things that bring you joy and humor

Practicing gratitude Exercise

Practicing self-care Eating and sleeping well

Practicing mindfulness/meditation Thinking of yourself as a warrior

There is also a request from our parishioners to provide more Bible study opportunities. Bible study needs "teachers" (volunteers within the congregation) and those expensive study materials. As a congregation we are responsible for satisfying the appetite to study and the need to learn more about God's Word.
