With the change of season I've contemplated sharing about stewardship or gratitude, then I realized they are partners in our lives. Each one works with the other. As we try to decide which came first, like the chicken and the egg, we realize they cannot be separated. My personal stories of stewardship go back to when I was a kid, and ten cents of our allowance went into the little envelope for Sunday School, I didn't have much choice, my mom told me and I did it. As a teenager, I didn't think of stewardship when my parents put the envelope in on Sunday. When we got married John and I put our money in every Sunday, probably \$5-10 dollars. After we moved to Yuma in 1970, to live by John's dad, we had no job and lived off our savings with 2 kids in a trailer park. I know we gave \$10 then. It was an act of discipline. John's dad lived on Social Security, never complained about money, but every Saturday he went to Faith Lutheran and mowed the lawns. I asked him since it was really hot and he was old why he did it. He said I'm doing what I can, I have a lawn mower and I am grateful for what God has done for me. He gave out of love. That fall when the dreaded stewardship "drive" went on I got a glimpse that stewardship was more than giving to the budget. Stewardship was a response or recognition if you will to all that we have been given and all that we are, is our gift from God. Now, the other side of our stewardship is the part that comes from our heart, not our checkbook. I think living a life of gratitude is the easiest and hardest thing for us to do. I shared with the church council that my Luther League Pastor always said that everything we do is stewardship. God gave us breath to sing, to talk, to share. God gave us the ability to work and earn money, to write a note to a long time friend, to check on a neighbor, or to take cookies to a grouchy neighbor. Stewardship is not only at 11273 E 40th Street, stewardship is wherever your heart is, just like God. As we travel through Advent and celebrate God's gift of His Son, take time to celebrate the season with a joyful heart for you have been blessed.

Our Angels have arrived!!! All the Angel tags are on our virtual tree and it is time for all of us to take a deep breath and welcome the joy of Christmas into our hearts. This Virtual-Direct option allows us to sponsor a child of a prisoner for \$22 to receive a Christmas package that includes a gift card to Walmart, the prisoner parent's message, a Gospel presentation, and an opportunity to request a free Adventure Bible.

Each Angel Tag shows one child's name, age and gender, city of residence, and the parent's message. You will have the opportunity to sponsor that child's siblings as well as the caregiver (new for us). If you chose not to sponsor the siblings/caregiver, their names will stay on our tree for someone else. When the transaction is complete, you will receive an email receipt for your tax deductible donation.

The site is very user friendly, and gift giving is accomplished easily in four steps:

No. 1 - Access the website and insert our church specific Access Code (T2CKG).

No. 2 - Choose the child you wish to sponsor – either confirm or deny sponsoring that child's siblings.

No. 3 – Go to check out – either confirm or deny sponsoring the caregiver.


No. 4 - Insert your form of payment – credit card or checking account information. Because our URL (uniform resource locator) is so long and cumbersome to enter manually, an email will be sent to you if we have it on record. The link will also be available on the home page of the Gloria de Cristo website and on our Facebook page. You can also donate with a handwritten check made out to Gloria de Cristo in increments of \$22.00 per child. Be sure to designate it for the Angel Tree Program and either drop it in the collection plate or send it to the office. Then Angel gifts will then be purchased on line for you.

DEADLINE: The deadline to sponsor a child is **early December** – exact date to be determined by the Prison Fellowship. If your generosity in the past is any indication, our Angels will be guaranteed a Merry Christmas very quickly!

ENDOWMENT FUND



ENDOWMENT FUND HAPPENINGS

On December 16, 2019, the Brekke family donated their family home on Del Rico Drive in Mesa del Sol (Del Rico) to the church, to be used as an initial investment to create a ministry endowment fund. That same month, the Congregation Council appointed Pastor Timm, Fred Freund, Earl Marlatt, Tom Radke and Gil Richter as a Committee to handle the sale of the home and the creation of the endowment fund.

The appraised value of the home (\$239,000) was recorded as a Contribution on the books of the church, with a comparable asset value. A charge of \$199 was taken in December representing depreciation on the home for the month of December. As of December 31, the home was valued for our purposes as \$238,801.

The Committee subsequently selected InFaith Community Foundation (InFaith), a subsidiary of Thrivent Financial, to handle the details of disposing of Del Rico and investing the proceeds after the sale.

The Committee created the Governing Documents for the Ministry Endowment Fund of Gloria de Cristo Lutheran Church, which were approved by the Congregation Council, creating the Gloria de Cristo Ministry Endowment Fund (Fund).

Using money advanced by the church, the Committee has maintained the home and property in a saleable condition by paying utilities and maintaining the grounds, a total of \$4,460.06. This amount was reimbursed to the church in September.

In July, the Committee re-deeded the home to InFaith, who arranged for a realtor to list Del Rico for sale. An offer of \$245,000 was received for Del Rico "as is" and was accepted. After deducting closing costs the amount of \$226,117.35 was deposited in the Core Growth Portfolio at InFaith.

In September, the Congregation Council voted to add \$14,000 from a dedicated memorial account to the Fund.

As of September 30, 2020, the invested Fund value is \$225,785.54, and the total Fund value is \$235,167.12. Financial statements are attached for December 31, 2019 and September 30, 2020.

Anxiety Disorders

Occasional anxiety is an expected part of life. You might feel anxious when faced with a problem at work, before taking a test, or before making an important decision. But anxiety disorders involve more than temporary worry or fear. For a person with an anxiety disorder, the anxiety does not go away and can get worse over time. The symptoms can interfere with daily activities such as job performance, school work, and relationships.

There are several types of anxiety disorders, including **generalized anxiety disorder, panic disorder, and various phobia-related disorders.**

People with **Generalized Anxiety Disorder (GAD)** display excessive anxiety or worry, most days for at least 6 months, about a number of things such as personal health, work, social interactions, and everyday routine life circumstances.

Generalized anxiety disorder symptoms include:

- Feeling restless, wound-up, or on-edge
- Being easily fatigued
- Having difficulty concentrating; mind going blank
- Being irritable
- Having muscle tension
- Difficulty controlling feelings of worry

Having sleep problems, such as difficulty falling or staying asleep, restlessness, or unsatisfying sleep

Panic Disorder

People with panic disorder have recurrent unexpected panic attacks. Panic attacks are sudden periods of intense fear that come on quickly and reach their peak within minutes. Attacks can occur unexpectedly or can be brought on by a trigger, such as a feared object or situation.

During a panic attack, people may experience:

- Heart palpitations, a pounding heartbeat, or accelerated heart rate
- Sweating
- Trembling or shaking
- Sensations of shortness of breath, smothering, or choking
- Feelings of impending doom

Feelings of being out of control

Phobia-related Disorders

A *phobia* is an intense fear of—or aversion to—specific objects or situations. Although it can be realistic to be anxious in some circumstances, the fear people with phobias feel is out of proportion to the actual danger caused by the situation or object.

- People may have an irrational or excessive worry about encountering the feared object or situation
- Take active steps to avoid the feared object or situation
- Experience immediate intense anxiety upon encountering the feared object or situation

Endure unavoidable objects and situations with intense anxiety with a phobia:

Risk Factors

Researchers are finding that both genetic and environmental factors contribute to the risk of developing an anxiety disorder. Although the risk factors for each type of anxiety disorder can vary, some general risk factors for all types of anxiety disorders include:

- Temperamental traits of shyness or behavioral inhibition in childhood

Some physical health conditions, such as thyroid problems or heart arrhythmias, or caffeine or other substances/ medications, can produce or aggravate anxiety symptoms; a physical health examination is helpful in the evaluation of a possible anxiety disorder.

Treatments and Therapies

Anxiety disorders are generally treated with psychotherapy, medication, or both. There are many ways to treat anxiety and people should work with their doctor to choose the treatment that is best for them.

We still take food donations to the Yuma Community Food Bank - 135 lbs this month! And the Collections Corner is being taken care of. Thanks to all the different folk involved in this small aspect of GdeC's missions!
