MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY The Risk of Falling

One out of four older adults will fall each year in the United States, making falls a public health concern, particularly among the aging population. About 36 million falls are reported among older adults each year — resulting in more than 32,000 deaths.

When it comes to seniors and fall-related injuries, the numbers are sobering...

Falls are <u>the number one cause of death in older adults</u>. Within the <u>first year of a fall</u> resulting in a hip fracture, one in five people die and less than one-third return to their pre-fall level of health. More than 90% of hip fractures are tied to a fall-related injury, with the majority of those fractures <u>occurring in people over the</u> <u>age of 70</u>.

The best way to avoid taking a tumble is to be proactive. Moving with caution, securing tripping hazards, and maintaining strong muscles through exercise are just a few of the ways you can help yourself stay on your feet. **Feeling safer avoids anxiety and stress.**

The Top Five Causes of Falls:

· Impaired Vision

Poor vision can impair balance and lead to an increase risk of falls and fractures in older people.

Medications

Many medications are associated with side effects like dizziness, reduced mental alertness, and drowsiness, which can lead to increased fall risk.

Balance and Gait

Regular exercise can improve balance and gait to reduce fall risk.

· Household Hazards

Environmental hazards like carpets and rugs can lead to fall-related injuries.

<u>Chronic Conditions</u>

Certain conditions such as diabetes, arthritis, and Parkinson's can increase fall risk.

Steps to Prevent Falling

Clean up clutter.

Repair or remove tripping hazards.

Install grab bars and handrails.

Avoid loose or baggy clothing that drag on the floor/ground.

Adequate lighting, brighter light bulbs where needed

Wear shoes, not just socks, around the house to avoid slipping.

Keep bath areas free from wet floors.

Live on one level if possible...stairs can add to falling risk.

Use railings when using stairways.

Join a preventive exercise program that aims at strengthening muscles and that teaches balance techniques.

Use assistive devices such as canes or walkers if needed for stability.
