# MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY

## Warning Signs of Mental Illness in Youth

According to The State of the World's Children 2021; On My Mind: promoting, protecting and caring for children's mental health – UNICEF's most comprehensive look at the mental health of children, adolescents in the 21st century – even before COVID-19, children and young people carried the burden of mental health conditions without significant investment in addressing them. According to the latest available estimates, more than 1 in 7 adolescents aged 10–19 is estimated to live with a diagnosed mental disorder globally. Almost 46,000 adolescents die from suicide each year, among the top five causes of death for their age group. The Pandemic has brought more issues concerning mental health to the forefront of our society.

Warning signs that your child may have a mental health disorder include:

- Persistent sadness — two or more weeks
- Withdrawing from or avoiding social interactions
- Hurting oneself or talking about hurting oneself
- Talking about death or suicide
- Outbursts or extreme irritability
- Out-of-control behavior that can be harmful
- Drastic changes in mood, behavior, or personality
- Changes in eating habits, loss of weight
- Difficulty sleeping, frequent headaches, or stomach aches
- Avoiding or missing school
- Difficulty concentrating, changes in academic performance

How can I help my child cope with mental illness?

You will play an important role in supporting your child's treatment plan. To care for yourself and your child:

- Learn about the illness.
- Consider family counseling that treats all members as partners in the treatment plan.
- Ask your child's mental health professional for advice on how to respond to your child and handle difficult behavior.
- Enroll in parent training programs, particularly those designed for parents of children with a mental illness.
- Explore stress management techniques to help you respond calmly.
- Seek ways to relax and have fun with your child.
- Praise your child's strengths and abilities.
- Work with your child's school to secure necessary support.

# STEWARDSHIP



Depending on your mail service, by the time you receive the Evangel 2021 will probably be in the history books. The years certainly do get shorter. As the year ended, so did the project of providing assistance to Crossroads Mission. Again, you were awesome!!! On Monday, December 13, approximately 1,100 pieces of underwear and nearly 300 pairs of socks (probably about 75% was newly purchased) were delivered to astonished employees at the Mission. Of course there is always a side story: an anonymous (by request) visitor from Florida sent 60 new pair of underwear and 20 pairs of socks. Just saying "thank you" doesn't sufficiently express their gratitude. You are GREAT and Gloria de Cristo is fortunate to have you in it's fold.

As Pastor Timm wrote in his opening remarks, we begin 2022 being asked to participate in a program developed and operated by Thrivent. Generosity Expressions is a "survey" or "assessment" of five different forms of Christian generosity. You simply enter the web site and do the very short survey...actually rather interesting and eye opening ... then the synopsis of your/our responses is forwarded to the church to be used as tools for future programs. It is a pretty neat program. As time goes forward you will be provided with more information on how to access the program. When you begin, all questions or assistance will be handled in the church office. I know, as we greet each new year, life seems to become a little more complicated.

Stewardship is a mysterious word!!!! Help is needed to open some of those mysteries. I am urging you to give some serious thought to help in solving the mystery. 1. Volunteer to serve on the committee. 2. Invent a theme or project that might be enacted (if you are timid and prefer not to be mentioned, put my name on it and drop it in the offering plate). 3. Maybe you can/will suggest and initiate a program from another church you attended....if it didn't go so well there, perhaps we can make it work here....All I ask is that you expose some of those thoughts in your head. # WELCA AT GLORIA DE CRISTO LUTHERAN CHURCH



Happy New Year everyone. The year 2022 has arrived, already delivering a bundle of blessings, most importantly, the blessing of our Savior. Once again, we celebrated His birth with prayer, song, and humble worship. Another blessing shared was the fellowship of our Gather potluck early December. Our guest speaker, Myrna Ulland, provided important information and history about WELCA, its origin and its role in the church and in the community. Myrna's encouraging talk helped inspire our group at Gloria De Cristo WELCA to search for a variety of roles and projects designed to contribute to the congregation and to the community.

One of the projects, already ongoing within our Grand Canyon Synod WELCA, is the making of "Days For Girls" kits. These kits provide equipment and instruction for girls reaching puberty in third-world countries. Shari Jones, WELCA Convener at Lord of Life Lutheran church in Sun City West, is scheduled to share with us here at Gloria De Cristo, how to put together these kits. She has volunteered to teach us sewers, cutters, surgers, and anyone who wants to help. On Saturday, January 22nd, Shari will conduct a workshop, not only on how to make the kits, but what it means to the girls of these countries. The time and location of the workshop will be announced in the church's bulletin. Already, kits have been distributed in Kenya, Nairobi with the next distribution planned for Jordan. I think we may find a use for them locally as well.

A "Gather" potluck is tentatively scheduled for early February, recognizing the many events and activities already planned for that month. The WELCA Board will meet on Wednesday, January 5th, 9 am in the Sunday School room. It's an informal, planning meeting of about one hour and we need any and all of our women to attend to lend their ideas, suggestions, experience and support. We would like to plan for a group to attend the Cactus Conference in March. More specifics to follow in February. Please plan to join us at the January 5th "idea" meeting.


