## Thank you's

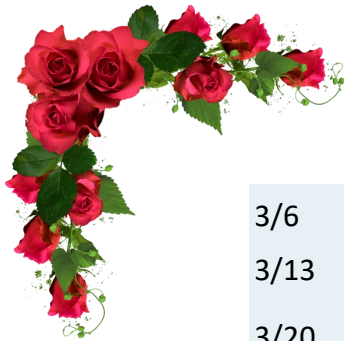

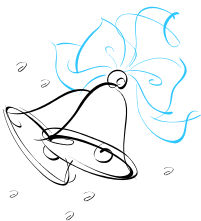
