VISION TEAM TEMPLE TALK FROM OCT. 8

Good Morning..My Name is Kay Lee Grunst. I have been worshiping here at Gloria de Cristo for about 15 years. My husband and I had been living in a motorhome for several years and most weekends, we found a Lutheran church nearby to worship. Small congregations, large congregations, friendly people greeting you and sometimes not-so friendly people that were involved in the busyness of the morning. Never thought too much about it. We were just visiting, so we participated in worship and went on our way.

Then we arrived in Yuma, and national economics, being what they were in 2007/2008, we settled in. We have been blessed in so many ways. Here at Gloria de Cristo we found the choir and music program we enjoyed being a part of and welcoming people who became friends and our Yuma family.

Over the years, I became involved with the council, the ministry teams and also the Bells of Glory, in addition to singing in the choir. I noticed the sign over the gate as you leave the courtyard and walk toward the parking lot. "You are entering the Mission field", it says. I thought — Yeah, I live a Christian Life and people can see that, so what else? Then I was asked to serve on a committee to look toward the future and where Gloria de Cristo would be in ten years or more. I had some ideas that the congregation would probably remain a group of older retired people, traveling and vacationing in the sunny southwest. But, I agreed to commit to a lengthy study which would be led by Pastors associated with Auxano (a consultant group). There are twelve of us on this Vision Team and we began the journey in February 2022.

Through all the session, we worked toward planning for the future and examined the organizational structure here at Gloria de Cristo. Were we offering the type of worship, bible study, activities, that would grow our congregation, make us better Christians? Our findings and conclusion have resulted in a new mission statement, "Walking with Jesus to bring new life and hope to every person", and a Vision for the Future of Gloria de Cristo to be a stable and growing community in the Foothills Yuma.

Our future is now! Each of our worshippers is encouraged to be active, not only in worshipping, but being a participant in that worship. Ushering and care of the altar and communion preparation are a couple of examples. Acknowledge the talents and gifts of giving we have received from our Lord, by generously sharing your time on a Ministry Team, whether it is attending a meeting and reporting on it or organizing an activity or cooking and baking for Fellowship Hour. And don't be shy about letting people know that you love Jesus and you want others to know and love him too. Invite (or perhaps bring) a friend to church.

And become a participant in the Bible Book Club. If we love this book, we want to share it, and learn more about it and it's message. Group discussions are educational, both in-person and online. The new sound system not only helps the in-person worshipper hear better and not miss anything, but the live-streaming of the worship service reaches travelers, and friends or acquaintances as well as our out-of-town members.

Praise God and be thankful for the past vision to begin and organize this congregation — for the present vision to be involved and support this congregation — and the future vision to expand our involvement and support the congregation.

This Temple Talk is to tell you that we are not done and that our future is now and that you — everyone of you in this room, whether a member, associate member, regular or sometime visitor or friend, or stopped by to satisfy your curiosity of what is going on here — yes — everyone of us, needs to get excited about our Faith and our love for Jesus.

Don't be left out. Don't just take it for granted that there will be a Lutheran congregation to welcome you. Someone had a vision and did something about it. Now it is our turn. Be a part of the future as we 'Walk with Jesus to Bring New Life and Hope to Every Person'.

MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY

Mental Health Ministry

The Mental Health Ministry Team is a group of GDC members who are interested in sharing information and awareness about mental health. Our goal has been to provide information to help destignatize mental health issues so that as a congregation we can strive to fulfil *Galatians* 6:2 "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ."

Over the past several years we have reported on many types of mental illness and shared numerous articles in the *Evangel*, bulletin boards, and church bulletin inserts.

The following activities are ways to learn more information, and help keep your mental and physical health in sync.

<u>Balance/Stretch Class</u> meets every Wednesday at 2:30 in Fellowship Hall. In November an additional class will meet at !:00. (Learning techniques to help with balance could save you from falling.)

<u>Mindfulness Group</u> meets the second Wednesday of each month at 10:00 in the Fellowship Classroom. (This class uses Bible verses, breathing, and singing bowls to help relax and calm you.)

<u>Caregiver Support Group</u> had their first organizational meeting October 20. Look for more info in future church bulletins. (This group meets and discusses how to cope with taking care of someone.)

<u>Dr. Ricky Ochoa Presentation</u> on Saturday, November 18 at 1:00 in the Fellowship Hall. Dr. Ochoa discusses caregiving, nutrition, and coping with dementia, and other disabling illnesses.

SOCIAL CONCERNS

Promote understanding of the human needs and social problems within our congregation, the community, and beyond

October Emilia Cortez, Development Director for Arizona's Children Association, attended our meeting. She informed us there are 1,700 children in foster care in Yuma County and 11,000 state-wide. The Social Concerns Committee will again sponsor a clothing/toy drive the last 2 weeks of November. Gifts can be for any age (0-18), up to \$25.00 and should not be wrapped. There will be containers in the Narthex and your gift needs to be turned in by December 2nd. Last year we filed a pick-up truck with Christmas cheer. Let's do it again!

December we will also sponsor the ELCA Good Gifts drive. This is an emphasis on missions where you can purchase a farm animal or other items to support ELCA missions. Volunteers will be needed to take donations.
