HOW CAN A TRAINED STEPHEN MINISTER MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN LIFE?

We'd just moved into a new house and had not yet met most of our neighbors. One morning, a fire truck and ambulance arrived at a house several doors down from ours. We were outside along with a dozen others. Across the street from the ambulance, I saw an older woman looking very agitated. So I asked her how she was. She then spent some time telling me that the ambulance came for her adult son who lived across the street from her. Apparently, he had been very ill but was finally doing much better for the last six months. However, this morning, her husband went over to visit his son and found him unconscious on the floor. The mother told me she didn't want to get in the way of the ambulance people, so she waited outside and then told me about her son's illness. Finally, the man was brought out on a stretcher and the mom ran over there.

Later that day, she found me outside and thanked me for listening to her; she said it helped her be calm. I never gave it much thought about whether I should approach her. I just did. This is not some tale to tell what a super person I am. It's simply an example of how Stephen Ministry is not important just in a more formal way (being assigned to visit someone) but in learning how to talk and listen to people who are obviously stressed that we encounter in our daily lives. For that alone, Stephen Ministry is invaluable. (Thanks to Neoma Coffi for this life account!)

Why do lay people have to participate in leading worship? Isn't that what the pastor is paid to do? In recent years worship leadership has moved more and more to the active participation of all people who are gathered, to be actively involved in worship. The pastor, for sure, is our presiding minister, but is greatly helped by the support of a well-prepared group of lay worship leaders. This gives the pastor time to well proclaim the gospel and host the meal. When others attend to various aspects of worship leadership – lighting candles, enlivening the music through the organ and piano accompanying and choir leading the singing of the congregation, scripture reading, setting the table with bread and wine, collecting our gifts during the offering time, assisting with communion, preparing bulletins, and greeting those who come through our doors, - they assist not only the presiding minister, but the whole assembly, enabling God's people to engage fully and actively in worship.

The use of the means of Grace, an important statement on the practice of word and sacrament, adopted by the ELCA in 1997 explicitly asserts that "All baptized share responsibility for proclamation of the Word and the formation of the Christian assembly." That means whether we are in church or during the time of our every day activity.

I sincerely hope that this five part series on why and how we worship has been helpful in not only answering some of your questions, but will lead to you seeking out more information on what makes worship important. Worship does matter. We are moved by the Holy Spirit to come to worship. Our souls and minds need to be refreshed on a regular basis, so that we can, in turn, go out into our neighborhoods and let people know of God's love for all. Worship spreads the "Good News". 2 Timothy 1:7

For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.

What in the world could Paul mean by this? Why would he bring a **sound mind** into the conversation?

Let's put a little context behind the verse. This is Paul's last letter..... ever, and he chose to write it to Timothy. This is important because Paul considered Timothy to be his son in the faith. He was writing this letter because he knew that his execution by Nero was imminent. Paul knew this may be the last chance to hand guidance to this young man that he had Discipled and hoped would carry on his work.

So while these words speak to clearly to us, they were actually written to Timothy explaining that God has given Timothy (and us) these gifts of the holy spirit to empower him and prepare him for ministry.

Back to the Sound Mind. I looked all over for this particular word in Greek, but I could only find it here is this verse. The word is *sōphronismos*. It's actually a phrase that means "an admonishing or calling to soundness of mind, to moderation and self-control". To me this means that God equips us with the power over our selfish desires and gives us self-control in all situations.

It was certainly a violent and turbulent time when Paul wrote to Timothy, and it didn't look like it was going to get any better any time soon.

When we look around at the world we live in today, it also violent and turbulent with so much sin and distraction all around us.

We, like Timothy need to practice moderation and self-control so that we are not caught up in what **we** want, but focus on what God wants.

Paul is telling Timothy and us that as we walk in the spirit, God is preparing us to share his Gospel of salvation by giving us His Spirit of love. His Spirit of power. His Spirit of Self Control

A History of Gloria de Cristo

IN THE BEGINNING—A history of Gloria de Cristo

January 25, 2020 will mark the 25th year of the ministering of God's Word to a Lutheran Community in the foothills of Yuma, AZ. This ministry is formally known as Gloria de Cristo Evangelical Lutheran Church—but before that date, and starting in 1988, it was known as the Foothills Lutheran Mission. Dr. Ellsworth Campbell, pastor of Faith Lutheran in Yuma, saw the need for this ministry and gathered people in a private home. Pastor Arthur Mees from Tucson was called to serve this group. Did you know?---Pastor Mees flew his small private plane to Yuma on Sundays!! Because of the growing population of winter visitors in the foothills this private home became too small so the mission was moved to the Yuma East Clubhouse. Pastor Campbell had retired from Faith so he began serving this ministry in 1989. The next four years until Oct. 1993 we worshipped at the clubhouse which is located north of Gloria de Cristo on 35th Place. I mention this because, unless you live in Yuma East you may not know of this building. It is interesting to me because of the murals painted on the walls—murals depicting the history of Yuma--- and to a newcomer to the area as I was in 1991—they were fascinating! These murals are of the Prison, the old buildings now used as museums, the Colorado River with its' paddleboats; the Ocean to Ocean Bridge; camels; donkeys and many more too numerous to mention. These murals made a winter visitor want to know more about the community we chose to make our winter home. Coupled with our wonderful worship service and our usual "coffee" afterward, it was no wonder we soon overcrowded this space and moved our worship to Otondo Elementary School. This move occurred in Oct. 1993 and became a year-round ministry. These articles about our 30 plus years of worship, community and fellowship will appear in the Evangel thru Jan of 2020. If any person was here before the fall of '91 or if any person has a special memory or disputes what I may have wrongly remembered please contact me at 928-342-0521. The next article will be on our 7 years at Otondo.
