Different Forms of Church Government

Dr. Erwin W. Lutzer of Moody Church says, “Biblically, the church is described in numerous ways. On one hand we observe that the local church is a living organism—an expression of the body of Christ. On the other, we know that the church is an organization set up by Christ and regulated by the guidelines commanded throughout the Scriptures. As a divinely commissioned organization, God has ordained leadership to spur on growth, purity, outreach, and holiness. Throughout history three primary systems of church government have dominated the ideological spectrum of Christian leadership.”

- **Episcopal Government:** The word “episcopal” is a derivative of the Greek word that translates into English as “bishop.” It should not be confused with the Episcopal denomination, a particular branch of Protestant Christianity that employs an episcopal church government. This form of government features solitary leadership structures (bishop-oriented). While this form of government does prove efficient, corruption is always a danger, and the hierarchical and territorial aspects of the system can be troublesome. Anglican, Orthodox, and Roman Catholic churches are good examples.

Paradoxically, The Lutheran Church, which champions the universal priesthood of believers, developed ecclesiastical authorities but not self-contained congregational government. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (1988) established the bishop as leader of the synodal jurisdictions.

- **Congregational Government** is at the opposite end of the spectrum. With a strong emphasis on the priesthood of every believer, it stresses the right of the individual congregation to order its own life in teaching, worship, government, and administration. The power rests with the members of the congregation. This form of government is most often found in Baptist churches who vote concerning yearly budgets, church programs, and leadership appointments. Divisiveness can be a negative result of this format, but the added accountability can stave off blatant corruption.

Presbyterian Government: “Presbyterian” is a derivative of the Greek word for “elder.” It appeals to the model of the original church. Many churches, other than the Presbyterian denominations, employ a Presbyterian church government. The church is lead by the eldership supported by the deacons. The church body may have limited say in the major decisions of the church, but those who meet the biblical qualifications for leadership share the weight of power.

Different Forms of Church Government (con't.)

The basic view is the equality of rights of all members, have a single office (presbyter) elected by the church members, analogous to the democratic, republican political mode and in contrast with the monarchy of the aristocracy of the episcopal church government. The differences between clergy and laity have been abolished in theory, and, to a great extent, in practice. The system can foster a 'them and us' attitude between the congregation and the elders, but it produces a balanced level of efficiency and accountability.

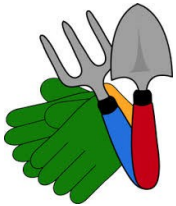
Willard L (Jay) & Anna L. Stokes

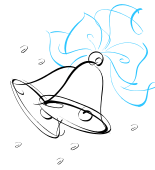
