The Morning After

"The next day the great crowd that had come for the Feast heard that Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem. They took palm branches and went out to meet Him shouting, "Hosanna!! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the King of Israel!" John 12:12-13

The last Sunday in March is Palm Sunday. Many of our Churches will provide palm branches to their congregation and folks will enter Church waving those fronds while singing their "Hosanna(s)". It is a Sunday of joy, of praise and of acknowledgment of Jesus' kingship. It also marks the beginning of what we in the Church know as "Holy Week".

Most of us have seen enough movies about the life of Jesus or have heard sermons about the cheering, palm waving crowd, or have read the Gospels that describe this benchmark event that we can almost touch, smell and see what's happening. We can imagine the crowds pressing in on each other, we can feel the electric excitement. We can see Jesus riding on a young donkey through the gate to the city of Jerusalem, smiling and accepting the praise of the masses. We can almost see the Scribes, the Pharisees, maybe even the High Priest, full of hatred and malice; already planning murder in their hearts. But this moment belongs to Jesus and the adoring multitude. What we cannot know is who in that crowd understood that this was the suffering servant who rode on that donkey and who saw a rebel leader who would use the moment to solidify resistance against the Roman occupation and lead Israel back to glory.

And what happens next? There's always an "after-time"; always "the morning after". The crowd goes home to where they are staying for the Feast of Passover and there's the next morning and the next morning. And horribly, there will be desertion, abandonment, denial, beating, spitting, hanging, piercing and dying. The same crowd that shouted "Hosanna" will cry "Crucify Him!" "Give us Barabbas!!" And what about us? We also cry "Hosanna", but then comes Monday with a work schedule, bills to pay, a family to feed, anxiety to manage, disappointments to absorb, grief to carry and fears that cause us worry. The blessing for us is, we are on this side of Easter Sunday....from Palm Sunday we know we will walk through Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and THEN, we get to thrill at our Salvation as we proclaim "Jesus is Risen! He is Risen Indeed".

CHRIST WITH US (Con't.)

We need to remember that Jesus looked with pity upon that crowd and knew they would call for his death. But Jesus loved all of them. Jesus forgave all of them and Jesus was completely faithful to His Father's will and suffered and died for all of them and for all of us. We're human, we fail and fear and flounder, but Jesus rode in as a King, suffered and died as a perfect sacrifice and now we are part of the Kingdom of peace and grace and mercy. Hosanna! Blessed is He who cometh in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!!

Heavenly Father, we thank and praise you. We sing glory and honor and praise to your name. Heaven and earth are full of your glory! Hosanna in the highest! We lift up our hearts and voices and thrill at your loving grace and mercy. Help us to remember that you have called us to walk with Jesus, bringing new life and hope to all people. In Jesus' blessed name. Amen.

We have now walked through Ash Wednesday and have heard, on Wednesday evenings, through the preaching of the Word, the need for the innocent, bitter suffering and death of our Lord, Jesus Christ. We all (each of you and your Vicars) have spent time through this season, examining our hearts, confessing our sins and have meditated on the securing of our salvation through faith alone, in Christ alone, by grace alone. What a blessed time for us all!

The last Sunday in March is Palm Sunday. Most of us know of Jesus' arrival into Jerusalem, riding on a donkey and the acclamation by a throng who waved palm branches at His triumphal arrival and sang "Hosanna!" "Blessed is the King of Israel!" This moment belongs to Jesus; not the crowd, not the temple elites, not the disciples. Of course, not everyone who hailed Jesus understood that He was not going to lead a revolution, nor was he going to restore Israel to power and almost none of the crowd imagined that this was a journey that would ultimately lead to arrest, scourging, suffering, abandonment, betrayal, death and absolutely no one in that crowd conceived of the idea of a resurrection. This Sunday will be the beginning of the week that has been identified as Holy Week.

Holy Week is the week that sees Jesus washing the disciple's feet as an example of how we should serve one another. Come and have your feet washed and remember your baptism! For those most fortunate few of you who perform the washing there is the blessing of being allowed to serve, to love and to mirror humility and servanthood. In it's humility, it is glorious! We will celebrate Jesus instituting the Lord's Supper... "This is my body, given for you"... "This is my blood shed for you". Come and eat. Come and drink. On Good Friday there will be the sorrow, the reminder of the illegal trials, the lies, the spitting, the scourging, the crown of thorns, the suffering and the death. We will see the altar stripped bare and we will leave in silence, in repentance but also in great expectation. Saturday is "quiet"....no Saturday afternoon service...the world is holding it's breath and then.....

Easter!! Oh Easter!! Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Our salvation is secured and we can walk in blessed grace, blessed assurance, blessed adoption as a true sons and daughters of the King! Come and celebrate the risen Savior, the fulfilling of the prophecy; greet each other with "Christ is Risen, He is Risen Indeed!" And then, depart in peace, saved, sanctified, purified, justified, already living the reality of eternal life and walk with Jesus, bringing new life and hope to all people! "Christ is Risen"!! "He is risen indeed!"

Please continue to pray for your Vicars and know that your Vicars are lovingly remembering you in their prayers as well.

From the desk of Dr. Shirley . . .



Lent is the journey we make as we travel with Christ from the Mount of Transfiguration to Jerusalem, where He will face the cross and the grave for our sake. This year's theme focuses upon the journey, though perhaps not in the way we usually walk it. Our overall theme is "Return from Exile: A Lenten Journey."

The beginning of our journey is exile in the wilderness of sin and death. From the first sin in the first garden, we have been exiled into the wilderness, where we have wandered without any ability to find our way out. But every journey also has a destination. Our return from exile brings us into the promised land—the perfect place, the new garden, the courts of heaven—the ultimate destination established for us by Jesus' death and resurrection.

There is great joy in the journey as we see where our returning brings us, but there is also a somber attitude when we consider what Christ faced on account of our sin. Each leg of our Lenten journey begins in the Old Testament and continues into the New Testament, pointing us to the joy that is ours on account of Christ Jesus. The sermons and resources in this series give the hearers the opportunity to contemplate the reality of their earthly journey, but with eyes always fixed on its destination—the empty tomb and the open gates of everlasting life—and with an underlying reality of joy as we hear proclaimed again that we do not walk this way alone!¹

Oh my gosh how can it be March already!!!

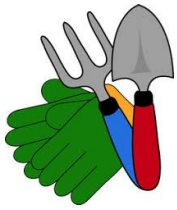

SOCIAL CONCERNS

“GO SEE” Tour

First let me thank everyone for the overwhelming response to “Chicken for Dinner”. We delivered a trunk load of chicken and tuna. They were impressed!

January 21 we took 25 members on a tour of the Yuma Community Foodbank. We met with Andrew Robinson, CEO and staff member, Mary McClendon. Mr. Robinson told us the foodbank employs 14 staff of which 4 are administrative. The food bank operates on a 10% overhead.

The YCFB is part of the organization “Feeding America” which is a national network of food banks. There are 4 food banks in AZ. The YCFB serves Yuma and La Paz counties and supports 19 local organizations including : Crossroads Mission, O.C. Johnson school, Yuma Sr. Nutrition Program, Department of Economic Security.

He also pointed out that most recipients work. Very few homeless people actually present to the food bank. One in 4 children have food insecurity and Yuma zip code 85364 has the highest SNAP (food stamp) recipients in Arizona. Every day they serve about 1000 persons.

When recipients come to the food bank they are registered, present identification and are tracked in the system. There is no financial eligibility requirement. The philosophy of YCFB is to serve anyone who is hungry. Food distributed by YCFB is supplemental and not intended to feed the person or family for the long term.

For DES recipients a basic food box is prepared. Recipients can get a food box once a month. A box is prepared from 1 person to the size of the family. Boxes are prepared by the 20-30 volunteers. Mr. Robinson noted Walmart pays their employees to volunteer at the foodbank.

Food used for distribution comes from, Federal, State and local charitable contributions, farmers and local businesses. Farmers donate what they don't sell. If food is not fit for distribution the foodbank composts it for animal use. Big box stores donate food that is close to the expiration date.

The food bank does accept non-food items and pet food. Those items are given to other agencies and not typically used in food boxes.

Mr. Robinson told us the food bank has more buying power than the individual. They can buy a gallon of milk for \$1.00 while the average price of a gallon of milk is \$4.00. So, if you prefer to make a financial contribution through Gloria de Cristo write you check to GDC and in the notes indicate YCFB. This way one check from the church can be written.. For cash contributions please use the envelopes in the pews.

Guess I got a little "windy" again. So this weekend your "generosity" is directed to Amberly's Place. I already received one donation from someone unable to attend worship, a box of 222 diapers. WOW...Think about changing that many. An advance thank you for your generosity. I will update you on the results next time.

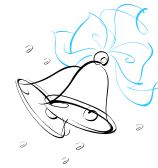
