“Finally brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.” *Philippians 4:8 (NIV)*

We are familiar with the caution: “You are what you eat”. We are aware, more than ever, what constitutes a healthy diet. We can elect to be Vegan, Vegetarian, or follow a carnivore diet. We can be gluten free, caffeine free, fat free, sugar free, alcohol free. We can be low carb, low calorie, high fiber. Sadly, I have to admit that after having gone without chocolate for a couple of days, I lose the will to live. *Mea Culpa*. We are admonished in Scripture (Philippians 4:5) to be “moderate” in all things. This would suggest that nothing is forbidden, but that our eating habits should be nourishing and balanced. We are also aware, more than ever, that an unbalanced diet can result in a plethora of health issues including type 2 diabetes, cholesterol issues, bone loss, obesity, even memory loss. It does pay to eat with your own well-being in mind.

In Philippians Paul advises that “what you think is who you are”. Your thought life matters. In fact, your thought life matters as much as what you do and say outwardly, up front, for the world to see. Shel Silverstein wrote: “Underneath my outside face, there’s a face that none can see; a little less smiley, a little less sure, but a whole lot more like me.” Our thoughts define the “real me”. What we think can be as damaging to our hearts as a steady diet of sugar and fat... clogging arteries, providing no nutrients at all. It is so easy to put on a smile, but obsess about that brother in Christ with whom you disagree, or to compulsively envy that neighbor who has all the best toys, or even to think death upon someone you perceive as an enemy. Worry is also a terrible “thought diet”. Most of us worry about things that never happen, stealing joy from the moment at hand, and implying that you can’t trust God to meet your every need. Compulsive, obsessive negative thoughts unsettle your heart, your hope, your faith and leave you malnourished to the point of spiritual starvation. This is dining on sin!

When your mind is wallowing in a bog of resentment, negativity, worry, remember Jesus! When we suffer with malnutrition of the mind and spirit, remember Jesus! Do not allow yourself to remain in the “junk food isle” at the market of infinite choices. Place your mind, your thoughts and heart in and with Scripture you have memorized; “The Lord is my Shepherd, I have everything I need.” “The Lord is my rock and my salvation, whom shall I fear?”. Praise God by naming all the blessings you have been granted. Pray for strength, for grace and find joy in the very healthy nutrition you can find in Scripture. Search for the good. There are no calories to be counted when you pick up your Bible for your daily devotion. There is no temptation as you lift up your thanksgivings. Find what is noble, right, excellent, praiseworthy...that would be Jesus Christ! Think on Him; His suffering, His death, His resurrection, His grace, His mercy, His infinite love. That’s how to have a healthy, well nourished, God-pleasing mind, heart and soul! Bon Appetit!

Heavenly Father, feed me with your Word. Send me the Holy Spirit and let everything I do, say or think be pleasing in your sight. Amen.

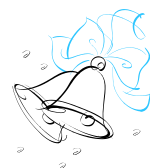
